PTAC Workshop Philosophy

The purpose of the workshops is to train early childhood teachers and directors with skills and knowledge that will encourage them in their roles.

Workshop training should empower teachers and directors with education immediately related to their current position.

PTAC serves a wide range of attendees. Workshop leaders should develop their sessions appropriately.

PTAC is an independent conference and therefore workshops are not for the purpose of selling products and resources.

Essentials: These are our core theological tenets. They are the principles on which our faith is built. Essentials cannot be compromised.

- We believe in the Doctrine of the Trinity; that the LORD our God is one. The one true God exists in three distinct Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, in one essential being without confusion. The Lord our God is the One who was, who is, and who is to come. He is the Almighty. He is Creator of all things and is the source of life, truth, and morality, the author and finisher of our faith.
- We believe the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the inspired Word of God; the authoritative and infallible rule of our faith and practice.
- We believe in the historic actuality of the virgin birth of our Lord Jesus Christ and His divine/human nature.
- We believe in the historic actuality of the miracles of our Lord Jesus Christ as conveyed to us in the pages of Holy Scripture.
- We believe that the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ were both necessary and sufficient for atoning for our sins and to provide us the only way of salvation and life eternal.
- We believe in the historic actuality of the bodily resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ and His coming again.
- We believe that we are saved by grace, through faith, alone, not of any works lest anyone should boast.
- We believe God created mankind in His image, male and female He created them (Genesis 1:27). Human beings are both spiritual and physical creatures, and all humans are descendants of Adam and Eve.
- We believe in the universality of sin. Since the fall, (Genesis 3), every person has been born with an internal sin nature that causes us to rebel against God and His will. The only way to be restored to right relationship with God is through faith in Jesus Christ. “For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is Christ Jesus.” (Romans 3:23-24)

Preparing to Complete the Application

To save time before opening the application, consider having some information ready to go.

Listed below are some key items that are to be provided. Please note the specific requirements for each one.

Personal Information

Bio-Provide a 50-word bio, professionally edited.

Headshot Provide a high quality headshot, 200x200 pixels (Ratio 1:1)

Reference New applicants will be asked to submit the name, email, and phone number of a person (not family) that can vouch for their speaking ability.

Workshop Submissions

Workshop Title Ensure titles are concise and captivating.

Workshop Description Provide a 25-word description for each topic submission. Clearly identify the “why” and learning objective of the workshop. Unclear and long descriptions will significantly and negatively affect the scoring of your application.

Takeaway Provide 1 main takeaway for each of your workshop topic submissions.

Category Provide the category (see next page)

Applications that advance through the initial screening will be scored using the following criteria.

- Relevance
- Uniqueness
- Clarity of focus
- Usefulness of Takeaway
- Overall helpfulness to the leader

FAQ's

Do I receive compensation for teaching at **PTAC ?**

We offer speakers a \$150 honorarium per workshop/ hour of training taught.

Would any of my travel costs be covered?

No. Due to the number of speakers present at **PTAC** , it is not feasible to provide for travel, meal, and accommodation expenses for each workshop presenter.

What if I want to collaborate with other speakers for a workshop?

If you would like to co-teach a workshop with another speaker the honorarium will be split between the two of you. Both of you must fill out the application.

Can I participate in the rest of the conference?

All **PTAC** workshop speakers receive complimentary access to the entire event.
